COMMUNITY SPOTLIGHT:



This is our Frontline Learning Collaborative meeting for the month of June. Frontline is in response to Coordinated Entry focus groups highlighting the need for clearer access to community resources. Sessions focused on strengthening connections between people and services through shared learning, relationship-building, and resource sharing, with topics guided by frontline staff needs and facilitated by experienced local practitioners. COMMUNITY EVENTS:

On April 17th, community members gathered at the Cambridge Recreation Center for the Spring Family Connect Event, a resource fair dedicated to connecting families and youth with valuable community services and support programs. Attendees had the opportunity to engage with a variety of service providers offering assistance with CCSD enrollment, mental health services, employment and education resources, youth programs, housing assessments, legal aid, medical insurance services, welfare benefits, parenting support, vision screenings, and more. The event also featured hygiene giveaways, haircuts, pet fee assistance information, and lunch for participants. The Spring Family Connect Event served as a meaningful opportunity to strengthen community connections and increase access to essential resources for families throughout Southern Nevada.





The On-Site Family Connect Event was held on Tuesday, May 5th, at Palo Verde High School (Cafeteria), bringing together community partners to provide a wide range of free services and resources. Attendees had access to support including ID and birth certificate assistance, Title I Hope enrollment, employment and youth services, legal aid, food pantry and community resources, medical insurance and vision screenings, Division of Social Services, veteran services, meals, giveaways, and more. The event served as a collaborative effort to connect families with essential supports and strengthen access to community resources.

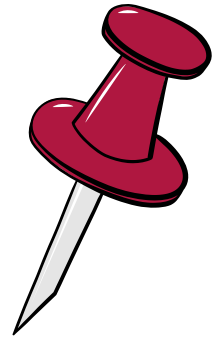
